

Change is needed to prevent women dying from cervical cancer.

Each year, there are over 311,000 deaths from cervical cancer worldwide. The majority of cervical cancer deaths occur in poor and developing countries. Cervical cancer is the leading cause of cancer death in most Sub-Saharan African countries. In most countries, there are few prevention, screening and treatment services available. Yet we have effective, low-cost tools to prevent and treat the disease, and there are new tools becoming available that will save even more women.

We are the catalyst for implementers, advocates, donors and policymakers to focus attention on the opportunities to prevent cervical cancer. We are coordinating partners, raising much-needed funds for implementers, and ensuring that cervical cancer receives needed attention to end needless deaths.

We are 'cutting through the clutter' of competing health priorities by focusing on one issue – cervical cancer.

We are a global public-private partnership focused on advocacy and communications to end cervical cancer by:

- We are 100% focused on preventing and treating cervical cancer.
- Creating impactful advocacy campaigns that push for changes in policy and funding. We are working to address important challenges, including:
 - Access to the HPV vaccine for girls
 - Increasing access to cervical cancer screening and treatment
 - Inclusion of cervical cancer screening in women's health services
- Raising funds from traditional and new supporters, educating them on cervical cancer, and working with them to leverage new funds for advocacy and implementation
- Working with national and international leaders to build momentum – building ambassadors and advocates out of First Ladies, Ministers of Health, and other international and local leaders

- Building coalitions to pilot and evaluate new programs and technologies that will allow us to reach more girls and women
- Ensuring cervical cancer is on the global agenda with conference main stage presence for leaders and funders willing to talk about the issue
- Sourcing, and commissioning, compelling research that shows the benefits of integrating cervical cancer screenings into other healthcare services, especially for HIV/AIDS and reproductive health, and creating national and international pressure to change policies
- Ensuring efficient coordination among organizations working on cervical cancer, and with countries that want to partner with us.
